FEEDING INSTRUCTIONS

Mature Horses – Minimum of 4 pounds per 1,000 lb. body weight per day or up to free-choice along with grass or good quality hay free-choice.

Lactating Mares or Breeding Stallions – Minimum of 10 pounds per 1,000 lb. bodyweight per day or up to free-choice along with grass or good quality hay free-choice.

Nursing or Weaned Foals – Offer free-choice along with grass or good quality hay free-choice.

When changing to Kool & Kalm feed only hay and water for 24 hours, then begin feeding Kool & Kalm at recommended rate.

May be offered free-choice, to horses. Have salt and clean, fresh water available at all times. Poor quality hay may lead to colic and other digestive problems. Feed your horse at regular times. Let horses feed at all positions of horses head height or lower. If horse is excited, feverish, hot, diarrhea, or showing any pain reduce or delay feeding.

Observe your horses' condition daily and consult a veterinarian if any problems arise. Maintain an internal parasite control program.

Prevention and treatment of common colic, founder and choke are difficult because the factors may not be readily identifiable. With good management of feeding one can reduce these potential problems to a minimum. If any of the problems occur, obtain immediate veterinary assistance. To help minimize these dangers, provide plenty of clean water, correct all dental problems, and prevent the bolting of feed. Choke (blockage of the esophagus) may occur if chewing and/or salivation is insufficient. Horses that are chronic to choke should receive a thorough medical examination: then follow the veterinarian's recommendations.

Store in a dry, clean, well ventilated area protected from insects and rodents. DO NOT feed moldy or insect-infested feed to animals as it may cause sickness or DEATH.
